

Access Working Group Summary Report

We discussed ongoing projects as well as developments elsewhere, common issues and areas where we need to keep an eye on. Out of the existing project, the Research Use Case, SOLR investigation and NutchWax Multilingualisation projects can be considered complete, at least the current phase. Masaki wants to get in touch with the National Library of China and Korea to ask their help with final testing.

The Olympics 2012 project is on track. NUT gave a demo of the Nomination Tool. There are some details to decide re. specific value of metadata fields but can be sorted out via email, before submission of seeds can start in June (I suspect this will be end of June rather than beginning because guideline documents on the use of the Nomination Tool need to be produced).

Going forward we have 2 new projects:

1): memento The Group discussed the memento proposal and agreed to run a pilot project . A number of institutions have signed up for this: KB-DK, BnF, KB-NL, BL, Hanzo, LoC and IA.

2) SOLR implementation Stories As a follow up component of the SOLR investigation, a number of institutions agreed to document their experience of implementing SOLR. BL, CDL, Swiss National Library, INA and National Library of Slovenia. A related (hopefully IIPC funded) activity is a training workshop on SOLR, possibly at KB-DK BL is happy to provide elements of training - Birgit will propose this to the SC.

All agreed that the researcher engagement / requirements is an area which requires ongoing attention. We however have not planned any specific workpackage for this. I will distribute Clude's report - which I should have done before the GA - my oversight. Also said that AWG will look at access related or relevant recommendations by the OII work and plan project to implement these in the future.
